PASTOR'S ARTICLE, October 2021

"Remember your First Love and Dance into your One Holy Life"

Happy Fall! Here we go, officially into the most beautiful season of the year (in my opinion). I hope you can get out and enjoy the beautiful colors on these lovely warm days, or at least see some lovely pics by adventuresome friends and family!

We invite you to a Listening Journey this fall. As a congregation and as individuals in tune with the Spirit, we are learning to listen *actively* and *attentively* in dialogue with folks who see things differently than we do, come from various life experiences, or view the world and civic life from a perspective that we need to understand better.

Conversations That Matter (4pm on Sundays) is endeavoring to learn and practice Bridge-building for October and beyond, as we research current issues from many perspectives and learn conversation skills for talking about them in our community and beyond. Our "One Church—One Book" exploration of *Love is the Way* by Bishop Curry invites us into that journey with persons of color and one another as we read and discuss as a congregation and in our homes with our loved ones. (*Pick up a book in the narthex, if you haven't yet, and join in!*)

Our CUCC Retreat on Oct. 5th delves-in to the personal level, as we explore listening and restoration of relationships in our family and friends circle, learning from the elephants how to live and move and have our being in healthy community.

The Holy Spirit has been working on me as I plan Sunday Worship. Listening to Spirit and the voices of the congregation has compelled me to engage more interactively and in dialogue in worship; to help us all engage our spiritual and devotional lives together. CUCC Council Minutes - September 15, 2021

Welcome and Opening Prayer: 7:15pm Moderator Merilee Daugherty, Pastor Rebecca Poos, Helen Duncan, Marjorie Erickson, Ron Hassell, Kathy Roman. Moderator Merilee Daugherty shared a Franciscan prayer.

Due to the small number present and the focus for the meeting being the proposed new Bylaws, we decided to forego the discussion of the minutes from August 18, the Clerk's report, and the Moderator's report.

Bill Waldorf sent out the Income by Month report (through September 14). General Contributions are \$5,668 in September so far with \$3,000 needed each week to meet the budget.

Continuing Business

The **Bylaws Committee** presented, section by section, the proposed changes to this document. Agreement was reached on the following Articles which make up the Constitution portion:

Article I, Name

Article II, Statement of Purpose

Article III, Polity

Article V, Members and Affiliates

Article IV, Faith and Covenant still required additional work.

The balance of the document, Articles VI through XXV, make up the Bylaws portion.

Agreement was reached on the following:

Article VI, Governing Body

Article VII, Church Council, sections 1, 2 and 4 through 6

Article VIII, Teams

Articles IX through XIV, Team descriptions and responsibilities

Article XV, Nominating Committee

Article XVI, Pastor

Article XVII, Pastor/Congregation Relations Committee

We need to revisit Article VII, Council, #3 regarding a possible Member-at-Large designation.

Team Reports

Facilities - Ron Hassell reported a new custodian, Sean Haver, had been hired for a two-month probationary period. Following that time his pay would increase to what has been budgeted by Facilities Team for 2021. Council approved the hire. Ron also reported the backflow we had to install last year is required to have an annual inspection, about \$125 a year.

Worship Team - Jennie Talbot was approved to replace Carla Hansford and will fill the term through 2023. Council appointed Jennie Talbot to fill this vacant position starting September 2021, and she will be added to the Nominating slate for election at the next Annual Meeting.

New Business

Delegates are needed for the Southeastern Association Annual Fall Meeting Zoom Gathering on Sunday, October 17 at 1:30pm. Pastor Rebecca, Helen Duncan, and Merilee Daugherty will attend.

Rocky Mountain Conference will have a Special All-Conference Meeting on Wednesday, October 20 at 6:30pm to vote on combining five Committees on Ministry into one Conference-Wide Committee on Ministry (CWCOM). Bylaw changes are needed for this change in structure as well. Following that vote there will be an election of those nominated to serve on the Committee. Merilee Daugherty and Pastor Rebecca Poos will represent CUCC.

Our Community Covenant -- The CUCC Community Covenant was discussed, revised, and adopted at the August 18, 2021, Council Meeting. An updated version, with the input from that meeting and suggested wording changes, was sent out via email prior to this meeting. "Our Community Covenant" of Congregational United Church of Christ of Buena Vista, updated version, was officially adopted by Council, Sept. 15, 2021. See below these Council Minutes. Our Covenant will be shared widely through newsletters, online publications, and website, and posted around the church.

Pastor's Repor

Pastor Rebecca has been focusing on our three areas of Ministry: Extravagant Welcome, Education, and Mission (Pastoral Care), and thanked the Council for choosing three streams to concentrate on for CUCC. It's very helpful in guiding the ministry of the whole congregation.

Work with the Faith Education Team has led to an exciting Fall Program for Conversations That Matter, starting Oct. 3 at 4:00pm live at CUCC. Discussion groups and sermons are being explored on *Love is the Way*, Bishop Curry's Book, and the congregation is responding well to the "One Church One Book" invitation. Rebecca and Molly Stuart are offering a Co-ed Day Retreat on October 5–spiritual care and education around relationships and reconciliation.

Rebecca is also participating in community panel discussions and education around "Bridge-Building" with the Faith Education Team and CTM group—both in person in BV and on Zoom. An online class on Family Systems Theory for Congregations will start Sept. 28. Rebecca will share her learnings with the congregation and Council from that class, which is a vital follow-up to the RMC Conflict Resolution workshops and Listening Team meetings.
