MODERATOR'S MOMENT

Happy New Year! In this new year "Make your light shine, so that others will see the good that you do and will praise your Father in heaven." Matt. 5:16

Well, the Annual Meeting has been set for Sunday, February 6 (don't worry, it is one week before the Super Bowl). At the meeting, we will approve the Slate of Officers and Team members. The slate is shown inside this newsletter. We can use more volunteers, so just let me know of your interest and we will include you. The current bylaws state that a person can serve only two terms on the same Board, or as we have been calling it, Team. We have found that we have a very small number of people in our church family that are willing, or in most cases able, to serve in such a commitment. That is why the proposed bylaws remove the term limit. We are blessed that the majority of persons serving in 2021 have stepped up to serve an additional term or complete their two year term. A few people have been willing to move from one Team or position to another. Betsy is willing to move from Vice Moderator to Moderator, Kay agreed to move from Financial Secretary to the Vice Moderator position. Both of these ladies have been with this church for many years and I look forward to their leadership.

We also need to vote our acceptance of the proposed Bylaws. Co-chairs Mark Wolters and Kathy Roman did an excellent job guiding Ann Condra and myself through the existing bylaws. We worked together finding fresher language, reorganizing sections for increased clarity, and incorporating new ideas. The link to view the draft of the proposed changes has been sent in the weekly Email Blasts and is in this and December's Newsletter. Nancy can print a copy if you contact her. On Sunday, January 16, at 11:30am, we will hold an in-person gathering with those interested in asking questions and getting clarification. The Constitution and Bylaws are living documents that require frequent review and updating. The last amendments to the document were in 2015.

Council, at its December meeting, approved the 2022 Budget for presentation to the Members. Bill Waldorf has worked hard to prepare the budget and many of the items remain the same as 2021, and in some cases the same as 2020. As has been the case in prior years, the income section always includes "Draw from Reserve Funds." We hope and pray that sufficient contributions will be made to mitigate a need for drawing from these funds and, until the last of the contributions arrive in January for the previous year, we cannot say for sure the amount that will be needed. Our building insurance premium has increased 15%. Because we had no claims in 2021 we avoided the 35% hike experienced by many of our sister churches. Each Team prepares their own budget for inclusion. They are careful with their funds and utilize restricted funds as appropriate. We were blessed this year to have received a federal loan, due to COVID-19, to help cover salaries. We do not have to repay the loan, as it was forgiven.

Sorry this month is more business than pleasure, but it is important to share with you information pertaining to the Annual Meeting.

"It's Nice to Have Friends Who Go the Extra Mile" The Winchester Sun—February 7, 2006

Often I write about going the extra mile, the knowing how to give of oneself past what is generally expected of us. I am blessed to have a few friends who continually go mile after mile beyond the extra mile, and I love them so much for such a gift. I also have a husband and three children who always forget there is even a line beyond which they go for me, which humbles me. But there are two examples of this in my recent life that I need to tell you about.

One happened the day of the memorial service for my mother. I was having a huge problem with an overwhelming sadness as I began to realize my life on earth would, from that day on, be lived without her presence. I knew her spirit would never leave me, but that didn't stop the ache of losing my mother. I was to speak at the service and I just wasn't sure I could focus enough to bring my thoughts out in any kind of order. All I really wanted to do was to crawl into bed and pull the covers up over my head and stay in the darkness. It was easily the saddest day of my life.

I started walking from the apartment we occupied on the Abbey Delray campus to the auditorium where the service was to be held. It was too early for everyone else to go, so I started walking alone, which I thought I wanted. However, in the doing of that, it only magnified my feeling of aloneness, and I thought I would simply fall to the ground with the weight of it.

Just as I felt myself stumble forward, an amazing thing happened. Two people came up behind me, and one of them took my right hand and one took my left hand. It was my daughter, Katy, and my granddaughter, Seri Jean. Not one single word was spoken between us, but then, none was needed. They simply stepped up to be with me, and I will never forget the power of it. That's going the extra mile.

Not long ago, my friend Julie called me. She was obviously upset and asked me to help her. Her beloved dog Brownie had collapsed as he tried to walk. One minute he was playing and the next minute he was down and his pupils were darting back and forth rapidly. He was obviously in physical danger. Julie had taken him to the Boonesboro Animal Clinic earlier, and though they couldn't be sure what was going on, they gave him medicine, and she returned home with him. By late afternoon, Brownie was worsening rapidly, the weekend was here, and Julie was scared to death. I would've been also.

I called the clinic and learned that the vet, Lynn Skaggs, had gone home for the day. I called his house and his wife said that when he got home, she would send him back to the clinic.

Meanwhile, it was impossible to get Brownie into the car as he was dead weight. I called back to the clinic and asked a huge favor of my friend Lynn. I asked him to go to Julie's house and that I would meet him there. Without one moment's hesitation, he went there. It was definitely going the extra mile. The way he calmed Julie and her little girl, Sarah, by being quiet and calm himself was so wonderful. Actually, his very presence calmed them and he spent as much time as they needed from him as he explained what the two shots were for and what she could expect. And as he left, he hugged Julie and said he'd talk to her in the morning, which he did. Just his presence gave comfort to them and to me, just like what Katy and Seri Jean did for me.

Going the extra mile and knowing how and when to just 'be' for someone in pain are both such special gifts of love. You know, we are so blessed to have someone like Dr. Lynn Skaggs living among us, serving us and our pets with such over-the-top devotion. He is never too busy to listen and to help and he is never too busy to give hugs that give such silent comfort.

I wish there was a way to write all across the sky — "Thank you, Dr. Skaggs, thank you. Your kindness and your humanity have not gone unnoticed."

The view from the hill is wondrous.


I have a whole new respect for the word flexibility! After three months of trying to regain the flexibility of my left knee joint following knee replacement surgery in August. I know many of you have also been on this journey of recovery from knee and shoulder replacements. It takes a lot of physical therapy, grit, and determination to return those joints to usefulness. The WMS' journey to function as an organization takes flexibility also, as was demonstrated when new plans for replacing the large refrigerator in the kitchen had to be made. A previously given gift of \$1,000.00 for that project was redirected by the donor to the Backpack Program, reducing the current fund from \$1,900.00 to \$900.00. We agreed that the need for the refrigerator was crucial for the food safety when we serve both large and small hospitality events for the church and community. The other consideration was honoring the \$900.00 dollars which had been given for the project. Our commitment to the upkeep, care, safety and availability of a well- equipped kitchen is uncompromised. Karen Bowers, Norma Smith, the Facilities Team, and others have given loving care to the beauty and functioning of the kitchen space, and we will not stop now. Gifts have come forward to replace the \$1,000.00 that was withdrawn. The cost of the new refrigerator has not been determined, but more fund raising will be needed, so if you would like to give a gift to support this project, please do.

It is often said that that the 'Heart of the Home' is the kitchen, and it is my experience as a pastor's wife, a church pastor, a campus minister that served meals to students, and a YWCA administrator of a women's shelter that a well-equipped/functional kitchen is at the heart of a caring ministry to help others and to provide a ministry of hospitality.

In the year ahead, the WMS will focus on a theme of "Sacred Earth/Care of Creation." If you would like to help with the plans for the New Year, please come to a planning meeting on January 20 at 1:00pm. Our first regular meeting will be Thursday, February 17, at 1:00 pm.

Beginning in mid-January, CUCC will provide free showers in our facility.



CUCC Council Minutes - December 15, 2021

Present: Moderator Merilee Daugherty, Vice Moderator Betsy Neas, Pastor Rebecca Poos, Kay Allinger, Helen Duncan, Marge Erickson, Ron Erickson, Donna Maloney, Linda Rak, Ron Rak, Bill Waldorf. The meeting was held over Zoom.

Welcome, Call to Order and Opening Prayer 7:08pm by Merilee.

General Business & Reports

Minutes of the November 17 Council Meeting were approved as published in the December Newsletter.

Clerk's Report: Ron Rak noted no changes in the congregation since the November meeting.

Moderator's Report: Merilee Daugherty said that the Slate of Teams and Officers for 2022 is mostly filled, with only a few openings remaining. Staff evaluations for Judy Phelps, Nancy Best, and Sean Haver are complete and satisfactory.

Continuing Business

Bylaws: Merilee welcomed anyone who has questions on the suggested changes to call her to discuss in person prior to the January Council Meeting. Packets with proposed changes of the bylaws are available in the narthex. Marge Erickson noted that there was no requirement to use Roberts Rules of Order for meetings and asked we drop them. Rebecca said that the UCC Rocky Mountain Conference views Roberts Rules as archaic, awkward, and cumbersome, and prefers a consensus model—the greater will of the group—to guide meeting conduct.

Budget for 2022: Bill Waldorf and Merilee reviewed major cost increases for 2022, which include only a modest 15% increase in property insurance since we made no claims in 2021; a \$2/hour pay increase for Nancy Best, Office Communications Administrator; an increased Faith Education Team budget to better support the team's plans for 2022. Bill made a motion to approve the proposed budget/seconded by Betsy Neas.

In floor discussion, bonuses for staff were discussed, noting that bonuses are not included in the budget. Marge, Donna, and Rebecca suggested a bonus for the Office Administrator, since she did an exemplary job in preparing for her extra 4-week summer vacation, for which she was not paid, thus saving the church that salary. Bill suggested an alternate solution in consideration of an anticipated 2021 budget deficit. We could solicit gifts of appreciation from the congregation. These, however, are only tax-free to the donor if given to the church, with proper record, and not cash. Rebecca also informed the Council that for 2021 there is a one-time COVID disaster relief Bonus Program that would be tax-free to staff/recipient, unlike regular bonuses. Betsy offered to prepare a card and envelope to collect a holiday gift for the OCA. Other personal gifts can be given directly to the staff via the office, as always.

With no further discussion, Council voted unanimously to approve the 2022 Proposed Budget, to be presented for a Final Vote at the Annual Congregational Meeting, February 6, 2022.

Where are we as a church, where are we going? Merilee noted that our congregation is diminished in size, something we discussed at our October meeting. There is concern regarding filling of openings on Teams and in leadership. As a Council and throughout the Congregation in all settings, we will continue to discuss our Mission, Vision and Values—where and who we are and where and who we want to be.

Shower Ministry: Betsy suggested a new community outreach modeled after a Salida Methodist church program: a Shower Ministry, to improve the plight of people experiencing homelessness. In her words, "One thing that makes a person feel really human is a shower." Council referred to a prepared document outlining the program. She felt that we have the facilities, costs are minimal, and this offers a "hands-on" ministry to the congregation which may appeal to many who feel limited in outreach due to the COVID situation. She suggested a pilot program for three months starting in January. Discussion suggested starting in the spring, because more homeless will be in town and there will be a greater need. Bill suggested that we can gain respect in the community by advertising it and in local conversations. Rebecca offered that many people may relish participating in something like this since it's hands-on with a limited time commitment. Council asked the Outreach Team to go ahead with implementing this in mid-January.

Team Reports

The floor was opened for questions for team representatives.

Women's Missionary Society: Marge Erickson announced the next group meeting is December 16, with the program being a discussion of our heritage. Nominations for next year's officers will be taken. She also suggested a special offering for the recent Kentucky tornado disaster be mentioned in church and in the newsletter.

New Business

The Slate of Teams and Officers for 2022 was presented. All Officer positions were filled and all teams had enough persons to continue. All teams could use a person or two. Term limits were noted as being eliminated for team members in the new bylaws; Merilee will note this in the January newsletter. Helen indicated that she and Bob Stocker were discussing combining the Outreach and Stewardship/Visioning teams. Bill was of the opinion that their functions were really quite different and that

should be considered. Helen also noted that the Pastor/Congregation Relations Committee is not listed on the slate, since those members are not elected, but the Newsletter always includes a list of members and possibly an informational piece about the PCRC.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Rebecca expressed her joy in successfully completing the annual staff evaluations, which were positive and supportive. She was also encouraged by a couple of new contacts who expressed interest in visiting the church soon. She recently completed a 12-week (2-hour-weekly) online-by-Zoom Methodist course on Family Systems, which was great education on conflict management and new ideas on communicating with people. Christmas caroling to selected homes is planned for Sunday, December 19 at 4:00pm, with chicken cacciatore and cookies for the singers at Betsy's afterwards. Rebecca was especially glad to see Norma, Vivian, and Warren at recent Sunday services, and pleased that Nan Bohe was coming "home" to Columbine Manor this month.

<u>Adjournment:</u> Meeting closed with Rebecca mentioning prayer concerns, followed by a closing prayer. Meeting adjourned at 8:44pm.
